

FPC Montgomery Family,

I think most people around me have figured out that I do enjoy this time of year and what is coming ahead of us. But I truly love the Christmas season! It is absolutely one of my favorite times of the year. From celebrating Advent, the longing for the arrival of the Christ child, to the season of love and giving, the time with family and friends, the songs, lights, everything. So much of it can make it tough for me to focus on what is really going on here. What does this all mean; not what does the non-stop blast of commercialization say it is.

One of my favorite devotionals is by Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a twentieth-century theologian. He has always interested me deeply for many reasons, one being that during World War 2 he decided that to live out his faith meant taking part in a plot to assassinate Adolf Hitler (clergy and assassin – how do we reconcile this?). For this he was arrested, imprisoned and executed. During the midst of this wonderful Christmas season these are the words I read written by this man:

"We cannot approach the manger of the Christ child in the same way we approach the cradle of another child. Rather, when we go to his manger, something happens, and we cannot leave it again unless we have been judged or redeemed. Here we must either collapse or know the mercy of God directed toward us.

"What does that mean? Isn't all of this just a way of speaking? Isn't it just pastoral exaggeration of pretty and pious legend? What does it mean that such things are said about the Christ child? Those who want to take it as a way of speaking will do so and continue to celebrate Advent and Christmas as before, with pagan indifference. For us it is not just a way of speaking. For that's just it: it is God himself, the Lord and Creator of all things, who is so small here, who is hidden here in the corner, who enters into the plainness of the world, who meets us in the helplessness and defenselessness of a child, and wants to be with us. And he does this not out of playfulness or sport, because we find that so touching, but in order to show us where he is and who he is, and in order from this place to judge and devalue and dethrone all human ambition.

"The throne of God in the world is not on human thrones, but in human depths, in the manger. Standing around his throne there are not flattering vassals but dark, unknown, questionable figures who cannot get their fill of this miracle and want to live entirely by the mercy of God."

It is God himself! This is my source of excitement; that I get to be like that young youthful spirit waiting with glowing eyes and nearly jumping out of my own skin as I wait for the best gift I could ever receive! I get to gaze upon this empty manger and long for Christ's arrival, one of the many "questionable figures who cannot get their fill of this miracle." One of the best parts is that I get to do this while surrounded by my family and friends, by all of you. I get to do all this while teaching my daughter about this wonderful Christ child and all that he has done for us and for the first time introduce my son to the same things.

As you take your place alongside this manger of Christ, awaiting his arrival, I pray that you too will find your hearts filled with joy and expectation. For you are in a season to remember the greatest gift you have every received!

PASTOR EMERITUS CELEBRATION

It seems so long ago that we applied to have **The Reverend Paul M. Milz** designated as our Pastor Emeritus – and that is because it was! The Presbytery of Hudson River did not delay in granting that status, but COVID-19 intervened and changed our celebratory plans. Now, eighteen months later than originally planned, we are at last celebrating that milestone! On Saturday, November 6th, we are having dinner with Paul at The Venue at Winding Hills and the celebration continues on Sunday, November 7th, during our worship service and at a luncheon in Fellowship Hall afterwards. Reservations for the dinner are now closed, but feel free to come to worship and the luncheon! (Covid precautions are being followed.)

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

The Session wants everyone to be informed on a current project and some of the financial implications associated with it. We are currently in the process of scheduling repairs, replacement, and installation of our heating and air conditioning systems in the entire building.

This is driven by a few things. The first is that some of our heating systems are in great need of fixing or replacing. They have gotten old, stopped working, or have become extremely inefficient. The heating system on the classroom/fellowship hall portion of the building is a double fan furnace which is not young. We also should note that this side of the building is currently all one zone (meaning that when you heat the classrooms downstairs you heat everything on that side of the building). This is set to be changed to two zones. The heater coils that provide the forced air on the sanctuary side are either very difficult to access (one of them) or in need of replacement (the other). The second is the air conditioning. The sanctuary air conditioning condensers are older and have a lot of wear on them which have made them very inefficient. If you attended worship in person this summer you will know that it was a struggle for them to keep up even on a not-so-hot day. We are also pretty sure everyone knows that there is no air conditioning on the classroom/fellowship hall part of the building.

Well, thanks to a no-interest loan program through Hudson River Presbytery, that is all about to change! We will be getting all of these things repaired, replaced, and installed! The program from the presbytery offers a no-interest \$25,000 loan that can be used toward capital projects. Congregations are asked to pay back \$5,000 a year and, if that is done, *the last payment is forgiven*. We have been given this loan! In each of 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2025 we will pay back the presbytery \$5,000 (a total of \$20,000). We have already received that check for \$25,000 to go toward the work!

The full project will cost \$34,691.61. Our immediate out of pocket cost will be \$9691.61. In all, doing the project with the use of the Hudson Presbytery loan we will save \$5,000 on the full cost of the project! We are very thankful for this being offered to us through the collective resources of our Presbytery.

If you would ever like to directly contribute to these expenses you can give an offering and make a note it is for heating and air or presbytery loan repayment. We will use those funds for that expressed purpose. (Please make it a separate check from your regular giving as it will go into the Capitl Improvements Fund, which is a separate account.) If you have any questions about this work or anything we are doing please do not hesitate to let us know.

FISH FRY DINNER

On Saturday, November 13th, we will be having a To-Go Fish Fry instead of an Oyster Supper. The cost of the oysters is just too much to make it worthwhile right now. The fish will be prepared by Tastefully British and package by our volunteers. Dinners will included fish, coleslaw, and bottled water. Tickets are \$15 for adults and \$10 for children.
